Biblical Worldview

Millennials – 44% claim a biblical worldview

Gen Xers – 53% claim a biblical worldview.

Baby Boomers - 54% claim a biblical worldview.

Elders – 62% claim a biblical worldview (the combined generations of people over 75)

Clash of Cultures

Hatred is an intense negative emotional response towards certain people, things or ideas, usually related to opposition or revulsion toward something. Hatred is often associated with intense feelings of anger, contempt, and disgust.

Hate is about negative emotion

Hate always produces a response and always has a specific target





Just because I disagree with something, or somebody does not mean I hate it or them

We are designating the open discussion of ideas as hate

We are classifying the disagreement with hate

The Target of Hate

You are not the target of this hate

Jesus: If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first

God: Whoever hates me hates my Father as well

Sin: If I had not done among them the works no one else did, they would not be guilty of sin.

As it is, they have seen, and yet they have hated both me and my Father.

The Target of Hate

Faith: As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you.

Inner Conflict





Followers of Christ will be the recipient of Hate

If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also. If they obeyed my teaching, they will obey yours also.

The inability to handle the hate will cause many to turn and start hating (Matthew 24:10)

To overcome hate we stand firm not attack strong (Mark 13:13)





Love the Sinner Hate the Sin

Judgement (John 7:24): Stop judging by mere appearances, but instead judge correctly

Justifying (Luke 16:15): He said to them, "You are the ones who justify yourselves in the eyes of others, but God knows your hearts. What people value highly is detestable in God's sight

But Seldom Jesus (John 5:22): Moreover, the Father judges no one, but has entrusted all judgment to the Son,
