

What is Suffering?

Suffering: the state of undergoing pain, distress, or hardship

Persecution: Hostility and ill-treatment, especially based on ethnicity, religion, or sexual orientation or political beliefs; persistent annoyance or harassment

All true persecution can lead to suffering, but not all suffering is persecution related (Romans 3:35)

Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword?



Sometimes suffering comes in the form of hardship or life complications like illness


Sometimes suffering comes in the form of lacking

Sometimes it is just trouble, life happens

Sometimes its danger as we find ourselves in situations that pose a threat to our well being

Sometimes it involves death

It can be connected to persecution, but the words are not interchangeable



Reality of Suffering


weak, then I am strong.

It's not in Israel (Jeremial 25:20)


Edom is a reference point (Lamentations 4:21)

When was "the book of Job" written: Unknown

The Bible has two main sections of Testament and New Testament

The original writings have a genres or purposes for being written

The books of the Bible are not chronological some are, but most have overlaps



New Testament

Gospels: Time of Jesus on this Planet

(Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John)

History: The Establishment of the Church (Acts)

Epistles: Letters to Churches and or People

divided by author (Romans through Jude)

Prophecy: Revelation



The Law: Written by Moses – The history of God & man

(Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus and Deuteronomy)

History: Establishing the nation of Israel and the Kingdom of David (Joshua through Esther)

**Poetry/Literature **

(Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and Song of Solomon)

Major Prophets: Isaiah through Daniel

Minor Prophets: Hosea through Malachi



It was never considered a "historical account"

Job is not a book of prophecy

What it is, is a work of Literature based on a real-life person and actual events (A Story)


However, if you have ever read through the book, it best resembles a play



When I study the Bible, studying it in the context it was written allows me to make better applications

For example, Paul is writing letters to address specifics situations and people not creating or explaining church doctrine

Acts is a book about how the church was established, it's not a book on how to build a church





Therefore, for this series we will be studying Job as it was written

We will not be parsing words verse by verse

We are not going to read every line

We are going to dive into the characters and their interaction in the story

(God, Satan, Job, his wife, Elihu, Bildad,

Eliphaz and Zophar)
