The Gift That Keeps on Giving

For this reason, I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands. For the Spirit God gave us does not make us timid, but gives us power, love and self-discipline.

2 Timothy 1:6-7

He knows his time is short

His concern isn't just for himself but for the next generation, for the mission of Jesus, and for the fire of the Spirit to keep burning long after he's gone.

He also knows Timothy is struggling in ministry.



Don't Let the Fire Die

Paul tells Timothy to fan into flame the gift of God

The fire is already there, but it's Timothy's job to stir it, to tend it, and to breathe on it.

If I fail to do that, then I risk allowing my fire to go out and in so doing, end up ministering in my own power.

God lights the fire but He won't force you to keep it burning.



The Questions at Hand

Is your fire still burning or has it become but embers of the past?

More importantly, are you tending the gift God gave you?

You cannot fulfill the mission of God with yesterday's fire. You must fan the flame daily.



The Gift of the Holy Spirit

Paul says this gift was given through the laying on of hands and we understand through Scripture that the gift is the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit is not a thing God gives you.

The Holy Spirit is God Himself given to you.

He is God's personal investment in your life.

The moment He enters your life, He begins guiding you and if you let Him, shaping you from the inside out.



The Gift of the Holy Spirit

Remember what the word “spirit” means. It means breath.

When God gives you His Spirit, He is breathing His own breath into your life.

Just as breath brought Adam to life in Genesis, the Holy Spirit breathes life into us.

He revives us, ignites us, and empowers us.

You are not just forgiven—you are filled.

You are not just saved—you are set apart.



The Gift Who Gives

There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all. But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to each one for the profit of all: for to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, to another the word of knowledge through the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healings by the same Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another discerning of spirits, to another different kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills.

1 Corinthians 12:4–11



Every Believer has a Gift

“There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them... Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.”

Paul says “to each one” meaning no one is left out.

1 Corinthians 12:4 –7

If you’ve received the Holy Spirit, you’ve received a spiritual gift.

That means you are called, equipped, and necessary to the body of Christ.

Gifts are diverse but unified.



Every Believer has a Gift

Another list found in ***Romans 12:4-8*** these being more ministry focused

What you got is not the point—different gifts, different functions—but one Spirit.

The Spirit customizes the gift to fit the mission God has given you.

You have what you need for what God has called you to do.



Every Gift has a Purpose

Gifts are for mission, not just maturity.

That means your gift isn't just about you.

It's not just to make you feel closer to God. It's to build others up.

It's to help the Church grow.

It's to bring the Gospel to the world.



The Gifts Produce Fruit

By their fruit you will recognize them. Do people pick grapes from thornbushes, or figs from thistles? Likewise, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, and a bad tree cannot bear good fruit. Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. Thus, by their fruit you will recognize them.

Matthew 7:16-20



Use What You have been Given

If the Holy Spirit has given you a gift, and He has, then the next step is simple: Use it.

This is what our world needs right now.

Not just more knowledge.

Not more religion.

Not more church attendance.

They need people who are on mission, filled with the Spirit, and using their gifts.



Don't Loose the Fire

Let's go back to the church in Ephesus

Revelation 2:1-5

It started strong.

**Founded by Paul, led by Timothy, and
Visited by John.**

Full of sound doctrine and spiritual gifts.

**But in the end, they abandoned something
more important than knowledge.**



Revelation 2:4

“You have forsaken the love you had at first. Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first.”

God lit a fire in you for a reason.

He gave you His Spirit not just so you could make it to heaven but so you could make Him known on the way there.

Let's not abandon the flame and let it go out.

Let's reignite the Spirit within us.



Fanning the Flame
